Tree Seedling Descriptions

Species	Growth Rate	Mature Height Width	Description
Norway Spruce <i>Picea abies</i>	Medium to Fast	40-60' H 25-30' W	Medium growing pyramidal tree that becomes very graceful in maturity. Prefers moist, well-drained acidic soils; however, it is perhaps the most adaptable common evergreen tree to harsh conditions. It thrives under seasonal drought once established and takes well to city pollution. One requirement is to not plant in wet soils, where it will die quickly.
Douglas Fir <i>Pseudotsuga menziesii</i>	Medium	40-80' H 15-25' W	The Douglas Fir is a popular evergreen with a moderate growth rate and long life span. It performs best in clay loam, silty clay loam and other good soils and does not do well in poorly drained areas. Full sun is preferred. The Douglas Fir has very soft medium-length needles.
Tuliptree <i>Liriodendron tulipifera</i>	Fast	70-90' H 35-50' W	Also known as Tulip Poplar and Yellow Poplar, it's a fast-growing tree known for its straight trunk, showy flowers, and yellow fall color. The flowers attract hummingbirds and deer like browsing on young growth. Best planted in open areas and prefers moist and well-drained soil.
Red Oak <i>Quercus rubra</i>	Rapid and Vigorous	60' H 70' W	Large fast-growing tree with reddish fall color. Tree is broad and rounded. The Red Oak is excellent for wildlife planting.
Red Maple <i>Acer rubrum</i>	Medium to Fast	40-60' H 20-60' W	A rapid grower that can adapt to a wide range of soil conditions. Bright red flowers in the spring followed by green leaves. Fall colors vary from yellow to scarlet. Will tolerate wet soils, prefers moist, well-drained soil.
Wild Black Cherry <i>Prunus serotina</i>	Fast	45-70' H 35-50' W	The Wild Black Cherry hosts more caterpillars species than any other native tree besides oaks. In other areas it is grown for timber, but here it is better suited for landscaping and increasing diversity in wood lots. It provides pleasant shade and will attract birds and butterflies to your lawn. In the woods, the fruit is a good forage for game birds.
Silky Dogwood <i>Cornus amomum</i>	Medium to Fast	6-10' H 6-10' W	This dogwood is red osier dogwood's slightly wilder cousin. However, it can be tamed into a nice landscape feature with the same pruning as other shrubs. It's suitable for the wetter and less drained soils common to our area. Plant 2 feet apart if using for stream stabilization and 5-6 feet apart for wildlife habitat and windbreaks.
